

Outlander

by Diana Gabaldon

I first read this when I was a teenager (I believe it first came out in 1991), and immediately loved it: romance, time travel, with tons of history. This is the first novel in a series, which currently stands at seven titles and is still going, usually with a new novel every few years. Gabaldon describes characters so that they seem real, people I can immediately like, dislike, fear and love. And the way she colorfully depicts each detail in every scene engulfs me in her books. This book is why I've wanted to visit Scotland for years — and I just picked up Outlander to reread it, as I finally made my trip to Scotland in July and I wanted to be fresh on all the wonderful sites the book had me excited to visit.

The book begins in 1946 with Claire and her husband, Frank, as they vacation in Scotland. Claire is a nurse and Frank a history professor. In the midst of their va-

cation (a second honeymoon, really) Claire is transported by a set of standing stones into the year 1743. It takes her a while to really believe what's happened to her, and to grasp that the men galloping around on horses with their muskets aren't professionals reenacting history for tourists. Once she does come to terms with the fact that she's in 1743, separated by more than 200 years from her husband, things happen quite quickly. In order to avoid being handed over to an evil captain who thinks she's a spy, Claire ends up marrying Jamie, one of the young highland clansmen, and things get more and more interesting from there...

This book stands the test of time, and I still recommend it often. The author has books outside of this series as well, and has also turned *Outlander* into a graphic novel.
